We wish to appoint an enthusiastic graduate to join a strong, motivated department and contribute to all that makes Psychology special at South Dartmoor. The successful candidate will be expected to teach and contribute to Psychology courses at both AS and A levels and will be directly responsible to the Post 16 Provision Coordinator and Leader of Sociology. The post also includes a pastoral role on the sixth form tutor team, led by the Head of Sixth Form.

Psychology has a specialist teaching room in our sixth form building and is equipped with whiteboard, video, projector, and is located close to ICT facilities. Desktop computers are available for presentations. Resources within the department are very good and there is an ongoing input of new textbooks, video materials and ICT software relevant to Psychology.

Psychology is taught as a discrete discipline by specialist psychology or social science teachers. Currently Psychology GCE AS and A are taught using the AQA Psychology.

Examination courses are successful at both AS and A Level and the department is keen to build upon current successes and to this end implements a range of teaching and learning strategies. For example, traditional forms of teaching are complemented by more experimental forms of teaching and learning such as student-led seminars and teacher guided student-led peer assessment. Data provided by ALPS and Oxford Analytical is used to project examination outcomes and inform the academic partnership between student and teacher. The teaching and learning relationship between students and teachers in the department is very pro-active. The success of Psychology at South Dartmoor is built upon an understanding of both student and teacher needs. To this end the department uses student-led course assessment to assist in curriculum development.

The Psychology department utilises 'Moodle', a VLE, to provide a range of relevant resource material for students both in the form of theoretical information and research studies.

In sum, this appointment will enable a committed, loyal graduate, with creative energy and ideas, to teach in a Community College, which has a proven track record of successful staff and student development.
