

## Pupil Premium- A guide to practice at South Dartmoor Community College

### Academic year 2016-17

At South Dartmoor we are committed to every student achieving their maximum potential. The 2016-17 Pupil Premium budget reflects a continued and rigorous focus on high quality teaching first.

Research has shown that students who are 'Pupil Premium' are less likely to achieve as other children. The College is allocated funding to help close the attainment gap between students who are from families eligible for free school meals (FSM), or who have been eligible in the last 6 years (Ever 6) and those students who are not. Students who are in local authority care and those parents who are in the armed services also qualify for additional funding to enable them to meet their full learning potential.

The funding allocated to the college is as follows: £300 for Services students, £935 for FSM and E6 students in years 7-11, £1900 for looked after students and Children in Care. The funding is used to support a range of intervention strategies to help students improve. The following information outlines our Pupil Premium spending for the academic year 2016-17.
