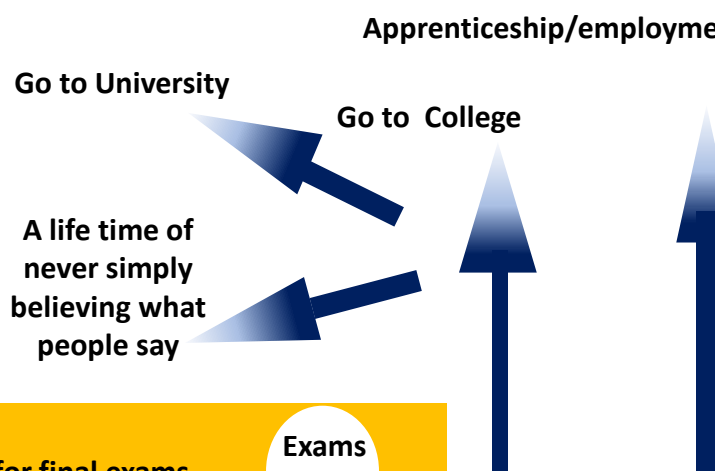
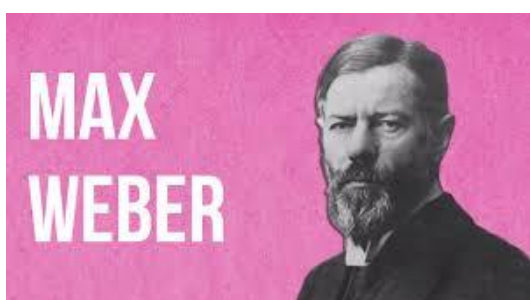

**Beliefs in Society:** Which social groups are likely to have beliefs and why? This will involve researching different social and cultural groups to identify any differences in levels of belief. Do differing beliefs bring stability or change to society? This will involve examining different sociological views as to the purpose of having beliefs for the individual, for communities and for society as a whole. Do people believe less or are their beliefs merely changing?

The final area of society you will examine is the concept of “Beliefs” in society. What types of Beliefs are there and why do people feel the need for a belief in society? You will be examining the similarities and differences between scientific beliefs, political beliefs, ideological beliefs and spiritual beliefs. Different Sociologists have different interpretations as to the purpose of beliefs for people and society and whose interests the existence of beliefs serve.

**Crime and Deviance with Theory and Methods:** Alongside the Crime and Deviance unit you will be examining in detail the various Sociological approaches to understanding Society. How have Sociological Theories changed and why? Again you will be encouraged to not only know and understand them but also to be able to apply your knowledge to specific issues and also to evaluate the various theories.

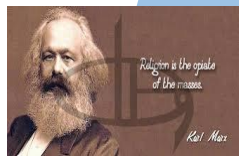

**After the end of Y12 mock exams you will begin examining another area of society which affects us all in some way. Crime and Deviance with Theory and Methods:** You will begin by examining what crime and deviance is and various interpretations of those explanations, you will explore who commits them and why, and how Sociologists know answers to those questions, bringing in your already gained knowledge of Sociological research methods. You will examine a number of different views on why there is crime and deviance. You will develop the ability to analyse each explanation and evaluate them and decide which one is most accurate. You will look at the way society has changed and how this has changed the nature of our understanding of what is and is not a crime. How concepts such as Globalisation has caused Sociologists to rethink the way they examine, not just crime and deviance, but the whole of society. How can crime and deviance be controlled?

**Work, Poverty and Welfare:** The next area of society examined is the world of work, welfare and poverty. You will examine What poverty means, what it actually looks like in society and how it can affect people. You will gain an insight into who is in poverty and why? This Unit will then examine what welfare provision is available to those people in society who need it and whether it works or not. Finally you will examine the world of work and it has changed in response to changing society. Why has it changed, and what effect have the changes had on Society and on people’s lives? You will be able to identify the connections between the education system and poverty and work, helping you to see the interconnectedness of the institutions in society

**Term 2**

Alongside examining the education system you will be examining how and where Sociologists gain the information they analyse. You will gain knowledge & understanding of Social Research methods used by Sociologists. You will also learn how to apply those research methods to specific issues, and be able to apply that knowledge to other areas of Sociology.

**We begin by examining the education system:** Exploring the purpose of education and various explanations. We explore various interpretations which try to explain how education affects people. We then examine why different social groups do better or worse in education.
