Here in the UK we are fortunate enough to have not only a substantial road network, from minor roads to motorways, but also an equally extensive rail network. This infrastructure facilitates, amongst other things, trade and business for the UK. At times though, these networks have been considered to be unequal in their ability to connect the north of the country with the south, creating something termed as the *North-South divide*.

A new high-speed rail network (HS2) has been planned and developed to help combat this. However, the UK Government recently announced that the Manchester and Leeds leg of the project has been scrapped.

What now then for this scheme, and its future for improving the rail network in the UK?
