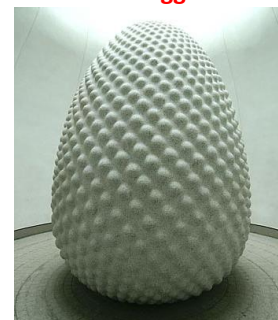
Home Learning Project: 8 week project set by teacher linked to project.
